

Outline for Intercessory Prayer Meeting

Praise (10 minutes) - Remembering Who God is, His attributes/character, His victory over Satan, His Promises.

“Yours, Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendor, for everything in heaven and earth is yours. Yours, Lord, is the kingdom; you are exalted as head over all.” 1 Chronicles 29:11

“Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.” 1 Peter 1:3

Thanksgiving (10 minutes) - Thanking Him for what He is doing now, His Sovereignty, answers to prayer.

“I will give thanks to you, Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of all your wonderful deeds.” Psalms 9:1

“I will come and proclaim your mighty acts, Sovereign Lord; I will proclaim your righteous deeds, yours alone.” Psalms 71:16

Supplication (10 minutes) - Unity of Body of Christ, asking for Spirit-led thoughts, prayers and actions

“I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people. And his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come.” Ephesians 1:18-21

Intercession (30 Minutes) - Pre-determined Region/City, People, etc. Prayer agenda can include brief bullet point facts and current news/events, specific groups/orgs working in that area and the people of the area (locals, workers, believers, not-yet believers, evil to be eradicated, end to violence, schools, gov leaders, etc).
